Key Texts:

A range of Non-Fiction texts about people who help us.

Writing: Children will practice writing their name, writing lists and simple labels. They will give meaning to the marks they make as they draw and paint.

Reading: Children will continue to learn and review the Set 1 sounds and diagraphs. They will practise blending sounds together to read simple words.

Autumn Term 2

Maths

Key facts: Reciting numbers one to ten and one to one counting.

Number and Place Value:

Children will represent, compare and create compositions of numbers 0-5. They will then identify one more and one less.

Shapes:

Children will show an interest in shape and space by playing with shapes or making arrangements with objects. Children will select a named shape and begin to use mathematical names for 2D shapes. They will begin to describe 2D shapes.

Light and Dark:

Children will use everyday language related to time and will order and sequence familiar events.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will join in with singing familiar songs and nursery rhymes. They will use lines and shapes to represent people and objects. Children will use various construction materials to build.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will begin to accept the needs of others, take turns and share resources. They will demonstrate friendly behavior and build good relationships with each other. They will use their words to find solutions and solve conflicts with others.

As part of their Personal, Social and Emotional Development, children will also learn the importance of cleaning their teeth and managing their personal hygiene.

Understanding of the World

Children will learn about peoples roles and occupations in the community. They will also discuss how these people help us. Children will continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.

Communication and Language

Children will join in with repeated refrains, songs, rhymes and stories. They will be encouraged to focus their attention, listen to their peers and adults and follow simple instructions. Children will be encouraged to start a conversation with an adult or a friend and express a point of view. They will also use a wide range of vocabulary focused on a key theme.

PE

Children will develop their gross and fine motor skills by using the outdoor equipment, threading, using playdough tools and mark making. Children will be encouraged to become more independent with dressing.

RE

Focus: Festivals

Children will talk about significant events in their own experiences and will recognise and describe special times or events with family and friends. Children will also learn about the festivals of light.
